#### **General Overview**

### **Basic History of Building:**

36 West 56<sup>th</sup> Street was designed by Bruce Price and constructed between 1881-82 on one of the few open lots left on the block. Drawings of a similar building appeared in *American Architect and Building News* in 1879, and it is possible that the client of No. 36 saw these illustrations and subsequently commissioned Price. Montgomery Schuyler in *Harper's New Monthly Magazine* singled out 36 West 56<sup>th</sup> Street as one of the few successful applications of the Queen Anne style in New York domestic architecture.<sup>2</sup>

It is interesting to note that No. 36 was built to nearly the entire depth of the lot (96 feet), whereas the earlier Neo-Grec rowhouses built a decade earlier were usually around 60 feet deep. Price therefore had to solve the problem of bringing enough air and light into the interior of his structure, and his solution perhaps presages the similar massing mandated in the 1901 Tenement House Act.<sup>3</sup>

A subsequent addition completely altered the ground floor for commercial use. But the façade retains much of Price's detail, including molded bricks with round boses, transoms with small square window panes, an iron terrace railing, and a pedimented cornice.
