

Pursuant to the Rules of the City of New York (RCNY) subchapter G concerning Sidewalk Stands, you have 60 days from the receipt of the above applications to make your recommendations to this Department concerning this proposed newsstand(s). If we do not hear from you in this time period, then we will proceed with the application process. You should also forward any relevant recommendations to the Department of Transportation (DOT) and the Art Commission (AC).

DOT determines whether a proposed newsstand poses an obstruction to the free use of the sidewalk. In drafting your recommendations you should include any specific objections that DOT should take into account when reviewing the proposed location. The AC must approve the design of the proposed newsstand. Any objections to the design of the newsstand should be based upon the guidelines established by the Department of City Planning, which are utilized by the AC in its evaluation process.

Finally, please remember that the above application(s) is only a proposal and must go through the legally mandated approval process described above before it can be constructed or licensed.
